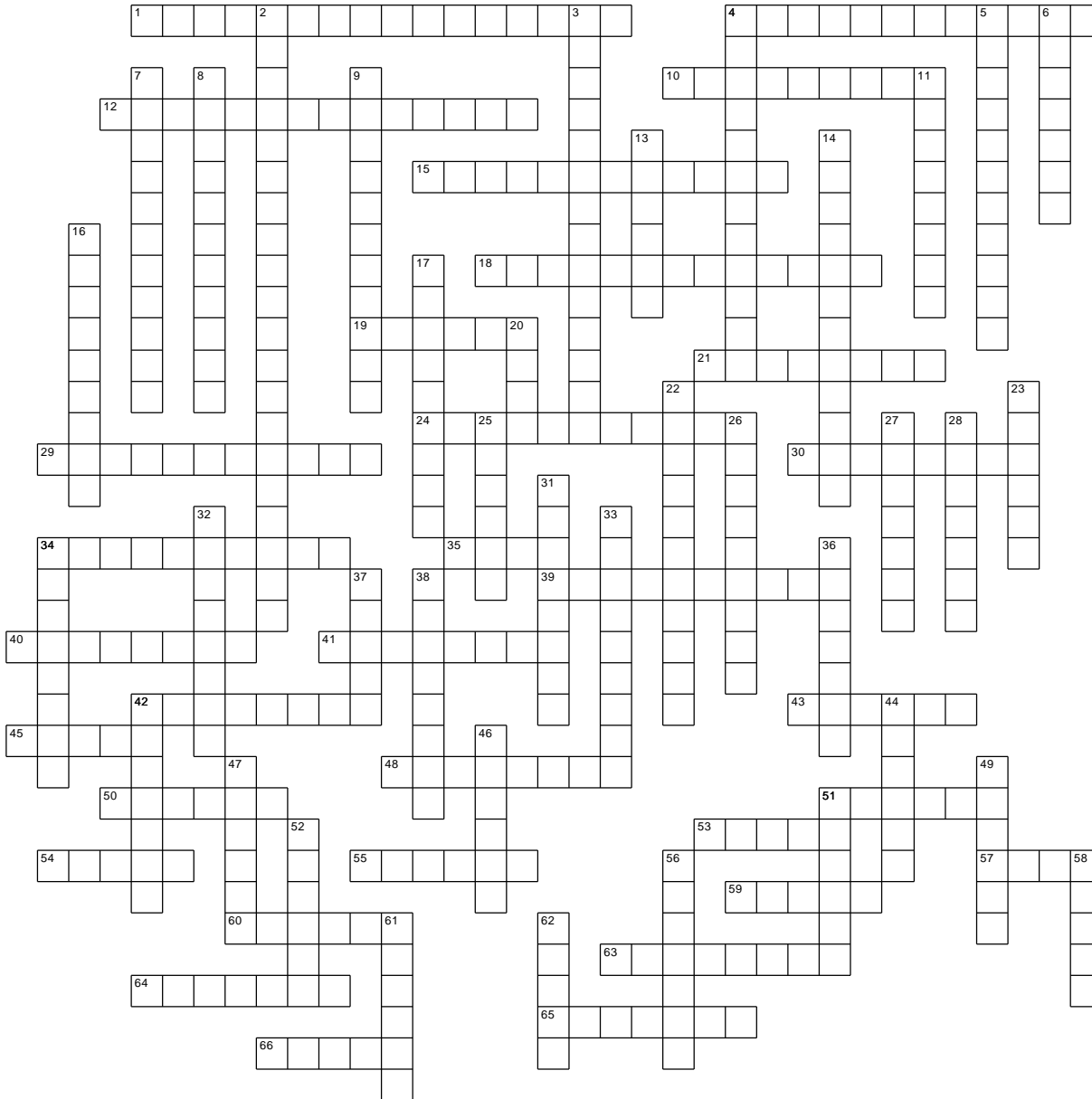

- Son of Solomon who causes the monarchy to divide.

- Son of David who sought to succeed him, but did not have his father's support.

- First king of the Northern Kingdom.
- Last of the judges; considered one of the most righteous men in Israel's history.
- Name given to the Northern Kingdom.
- Another name for Jerusalem.
- Priest who stays loyal to David and is rewarded by Solomon.
- Samuel's mother.
- He was hiding in some baggage when publicly chosen to be king.
- Michal despises him when she sees him dancing before the Lord.
- Tishbite prophet who wore a hairy garment with a leather girdle.
- Prophet who called the temple a 'den of thieves.'
- Archaeology offers no supporting evidence that it was conquered when the Bible says it was.
- Prophet among those exiled to Babylon.
- David's father.

- Solomon's temple was dedicated this many years after the Exodus.
- Babylonian king who defeats Judah and exiles its population.
- David bans them from his palace.
- Position David held in Saul's army.
- He offered a double portion in sacrifice on behalf of Hannah.
- Title used for both Jerusalem and Bethlehem.
- This book of the Torah was probably also written by the author of the Former Prophets.
- Both Samson and David defeat them.
- King of Judah during Sennacherib's invasion.
- Solomon was given this gift by God, and he is known for it in the Old Testament.
- Jeroboam made two of them to keep his people from going to worship in Jerusalem.
- Town where David was from.
- Wife of Uriah the Hittite; David's 'sin' was with her.
- Egyptian Pharaoh who defeats Josiah in battle.
- Nebuchadnezzar destroyed it.
- He was famous for his great strength, but his wives weren't exactly supportive.
- Daughter of Saul and wife of David.
- 'My father beat you with whips, but I will beat you with ____.'
- Giant Philistine felled by David with one stone.
- The Lord tells David that his kingdom will last this long.
- His foolish vow leads to the death of his daughter.
- Though a son of Saul, he was a close friend to David.
- David has the Ark of the Covenant brought to this city when he conquers it.
- Son of Ahimelech the priest banished by Solomon because of his role in betraying David.
- Son of David who builds the First Temple.
- The Southern Kingdom is named after this tribe.
- The worst king in Israel's history; blamed for the Babylonian Exile.
- Son of David who tries to usurp his father's throne.
- Both of David's anointing stories take place here.
- This river is miraculously parted like the Red Sea.
- The man from Ephraim who chopped up his concubine was one of these.
- Prophet to whom Elijah gives a double portion of his spirit.
- Prophet who advised Hezekiah to trust in the Lord and not form alliances with foreign powers.
- Considered the second greatest king in Israel's history; initiated the deuteronomic reform.
- Another name for the Northern Kingdom.
- The Lord sends these among the Assyrians who settled in the North because they did not worship Him.
- King of Israel at the time of the Assyrian exile.
- All true prophets must be like him.
